Proclamation

National Indigenous People Day

WHEREAS in June 1996, the Governor General of Canada announced June 21 as National Aboriginal Day, thus marking the

first national day of Indigenous acknowledgement and recognition; and,

WHEREAS in 2017, the Prime Minister of Canada announced changing the name to National Indigenous Peoples Day, to align with

the international recognition of Indigenous peoples and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous

Peoples; and,

WHEREAS June 21 is typically the summer solstice and the longest day of the year, which has significance for Indigenous peoples and

has been commemorated for generations; and,

WHEREASNational Indigenous Peoples Day, is a day to acknowledge the invaluable heritage, achievements and diverse cultures of

First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples of Canada (collectively referred to as Indigenous peoples); and,

WHEREAS celebrations include ceremonies that highlight and honour diverse cultural performances, activities, arts and crafts, and

events that recognize national contributions of Indigenous peoples; and,

WHEREAS we acknowledge we are on Treaty 6 territory and the traditional homeland of the Metis Nation and recognize the inherent

Aboriginal rights of First Nation, Métis and Inuit peoples within Alberta, as identified in Section 35 of the Constitution

Act of 1982.

NOW THEREFORE on behalf of City Council, I, Cathy Heron, Mayor of the City of St. Albert, do hereby proclaim June 21 as National

Indigenous Peoples Day in the City of St. Albert. I encourage all residents to learn more about Indigenous culture and history. It is our collective responsibility as treaty people to move beyond mere words to achieve true change through our

actions and move towards reconciliation within our community.
