



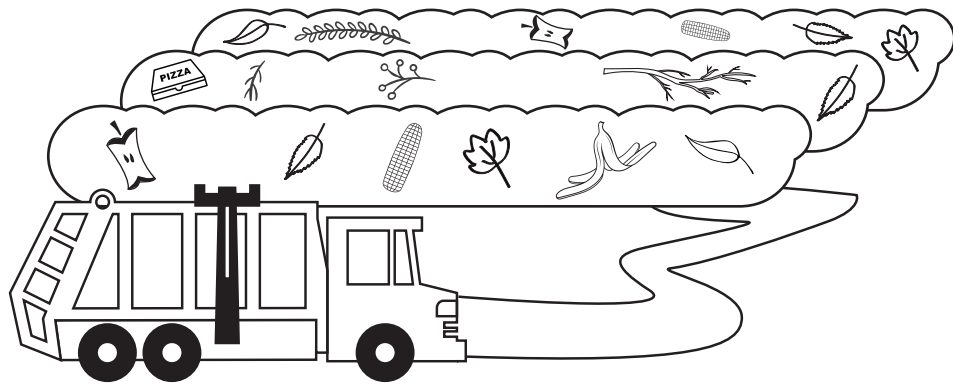
When you put a banana peel or leaves into the Green Organics Cart, it will breakdown and be turned into compost!

Let's look at what happens to our organics.



2 Green Organics Carts are picked up by the organics truck and brought to an outdoor composting site.

1 Compostable items, such as fruit and vegetable peels, soggy pizza boxes and leaves get placed in the Green Organics Cart. These items will get mushy and breakdown. Non-compostable items, such as plastic bags, soup cans and glass jars do not belong in the Green Organics Cart.



3 The organics truck empties the compostable items into long and narrow piles called windrows. A loader is used to turn the windrows, which adds air into the pile.



4 In addition to compostable items, there are a few other important components required to make compost: water, air, heat and time! Turning the compost pile is repeated in order to help break down all of the compostable items.



5 Compost is yummy food for plants and adding it to your garden helps your fruits and vegetables grow big and strong!
