TRANSIT SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENTS

St. Albert Transit will be implementing schedule adjustments and route changes effective **February 4**.

Minor schedule adjustments are being made to weekday service for Routes 201, 202, 205, A4, A5 & A14.

All other schedules remain unchanged from the current Fall/Winter schedule.

A major routing change will be implemented for Route 202 which includes a change to the NAIT bus stop locations.

Minor routing changes will be implemented for Routes 208 & 211.

WILDLIFE IN OUR CITY

With over 900 hectares of parks and natural spaces, urban wildlife is a part of life in St. Albert. If you come across a moose, remember these tips to stay safe:

- Do not approach the moose at any time, even if they appear calm and friendly.
- Maintain a distance of at least 36 metres (120 feet).
- Wild animals should not be fed and doing so can result in fines under the Wildlife Act or the Parks Bylaw.
- Do not allow dogs off leash near moose. Moose see dogs as a threat and may defend themselves.
