CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Starting in **January 2023**, the contractor will begin prepping the site for the Sturgeon Heights Reservoir Replacement and Decommissioning Project which is anticipated to take place from **early 2023 to fall 2024** in Salisbury Park.

The Sturgeon Heights Reservoir and Pump Station (37 Sunset Boulevard) is the oldest structure of its kind in St. Albert and can no longer be upgraded. It must be rebuilt to ensure the long-term reliable and safe distribution of potable water for the community.

A temporary gravel walkway is being added along the construction fence line to provide continuity through the park site.

The community will be able to use the outdoor rink at Salisbury Park throughout the construction project, including for off-leash dog use when ice is not in place. The Salisbury Park off-leash area will be part of the construction zone and unavailable for access starting in **February 2023**.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FACILITIES NOT SAFE TO RECREATE

Your community pond has a secret. It's not a pond at all. It's a stormwater management facility and

its dangerously deep areas and unpredictable ice thickness makes it unsafe for all activities.

While they may look frozen, stormwater management facilities have water continuously flowing below the ice surface. This means that some areas may have ice while other areas may have little to no ice.
