DOWNTOWN CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Phase two of the St. Anne Street Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project will begin the week of **April 17** and is anticipated to be complete by **June 2023**.

The project involves the replacement of sanitary sewer main and manholes along St. Anne Street and replacement of sanitary sewer services.

Impacts to businesses and pedestrians include the following:

- Partial road closures and detours that may take place for vehicles and pedestrians on single sections of the roadways at a time.
- Necessary on-street parking restrictions within work zones.
- Bypass sanitary sewer pumping which is not expected to impact the operation of downtown businesses.

In accordance with Section 692 of the Municipal Government Act a Public Hearing has been scheduled capacity of Agent for one or more other persons at to take place on Tuesday, May 2, 2023, for Bylaw 3/2023.

Bylaw 3/2023, if passed would amend the Land Use Bylaw 9/2005, Schedule A, by redistricting multiple parcels of land in the Jensen Lakes neighbourhood to Residential (RX), Residential Lane (RXL), Public and Private Service (PS), and Public Park (P). This is the fourteenth redistricting application for the Jensen Lakes neighbourhood. Redistricting of land is needed to enable subdivisions for residential development.

Where a Public Hearing offers the option to address Council in person, individuals and Groups wishing to address Council on their own behalf in person at the Public Hearing may register with Legislative Services at hearings@stalbert.ca up to one hour prior to the commencement of the Public Hearing and additionally a sign-in sheet will be available at the entrance to Council chambers for individuals and Groups who have not previously registered but wish to address Council on their own behalf in person at the Public Hearing.
