Located on Poundmaker Road, the cemetery is surrounded by evergreen and willow trees, lending shade to the grounds and providing dignity to this peaceful resting place.



STANDARD BURIAL

When selecting a standard burial, there is the option to choose either a single or double depth plot.

ASH BURIAL

An ash plot can accommodate up to four urns.

FIELD OF HONOUR

An area of the cemetery has been dedicated as a Field of Honour for the burial of any veteran who has seen active service as well as the individual's spouse or next kin.

COLUMBARIA

Columbaria niches can hold up to three urns.

The scattering garden offers an alternative for families whom do not wish to inter their loves ones.

The memorial pillow provides a plaque of commemoration for loved ones.



INDIGENOUS CEMETERY (1946-1969)

The Indigenous Cemetery is located in the southeast portion of the Municipal Cemetery. The 98 Indigenous Charles Camsell Hospital patients from the Northwest Territories, Yukon, British Columbia, Alberta and Saskatchewan. were buried here between 1946 and 1969. This portion of the cemetery was originally acquired in 1920 by the Federal Government (as represented by the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs), in 1971 it was transferred to the Province (as represented by Alberta Public Works) and then to the City of St. Albert in 1979. In June 1990. a service was held to dedicate the memorial cairn to those 98 individuals interred here.
