2022-23 St. Albert Annual Policing Plan Priorities

As identified by the RCMP, St. Albert Policing Committee and community partners:

1. Crime Reduction

Objective:

Engage proactive initiatives to decrease crimes against persons and property.

Initiatives:

- Monitoring and tracking of community awareness/engagement initiatives including promoting the City of St. Albert's RCMP Voluntary Surveillance Camera Registry, Lock-it or Lose It campaign and 9pm Routine
- Tracking of enhanced visibility including cart & bike patrols on paths, parks, block parties and special events
- Weekly meetings between Operational Support Units for information and intelligence sharing, hot spots, prolific offenders, etc.

Measures:

- Increase in confidential informant recruitment by 10%
- Increase in sensitive expenditures by 10%

2. Mental Health and Vulnerable Communities

Objective:

Enhance response, outreach and support for senior, youth and other vulnerable persons.

Initiatives:

- Attendance at FCSS (Family & Community Support Services) led community meetings and programs, referrals to programs
- Participation in VTRA's (Violent Threat Risk Assessment) and Wrap Around Program. Attendance at school to deliver programs and support, education and engagement in support of youth
- Facilitation of Botvin LifeSkills Training Program
- Ongoing training on Mental Health Tool Kits

Measures:

Ongoing engagement, consultation, participation and monitoring.

3. Domestic Violence and Assaults

Objective:

To proactively address instances of ongoing or repetitive domestic violence.

Initiatives:

- Ongoing meetings with task force
- Ongoing delivery of media releases to increase education and awareness around domestic violence.

Measures:

• Ongoing engagement, consultation, participation and monitoring.
