DEFINITIONS OF RESIDENCE

Residence is governed by the following rules:

- a person may be a resident of only one place at a time for the purposes of voting.
- the residence of a person is the place where the person lives and sleeps and to which, when the person is absent, the person intends to return.

FOR ELECTORS RECEIVING SERVICES OR SUPPORT FROM A COMMUNITY SUPPORT CENTRE – VOTING BY SPECIAL (MAIL-IN) BALLOT ONLY

If the elector:

- does not have a residence as defined above, and
- has the community support centre receiving mail on behalf of the elector

then the elector can request a special ballot using an attestation form signed by the authorized representative.

FOR ELECTORS CURRENTLY AT A CORRECTIONAL FACILITY – VOTING BY SPECIAL (MAIL-IN) BALLOT ONLY

If the elector:

- does not have a residence as defined above, and
- has the correctional institution receiving mail on behalf of the elector

then the elector can request a special ballot using an attestation form signed by the authorized representative.

FOR ELECTORS LIVING IN A STUDENT RESIDENCE ON CAMPUS

A student who:

- attends an educational institution within or outside of Alberta,
- temporarily rents accommodation for the purpose of attending an educational institution, and
- has family members who are resident in Alberta, and the student ordinarily resides with them when not attending an educational institution,

is deemed to reside with those family members.

If the student does not have a residence as defined in this section, then they can use an attestation form signed by an authorized representative.
