Daniel Lanois is a record producer, guitarist, vocalist and songwriter known for his atmospheric production style and influential work in rock, ambient and folk music. He is revered for pushing sonic boundaries blending organic instrumentation with studio experimentation. His contributions have touched practically every style and sound of the modern era. He is best known for his collaborations with iconic musicians such as U2, Bob Dylan, Peter Gabriel and Neil Young. Lanois co-produced U2's *The Joshua Tree* and *Achtung Baby*, as well as Dylan's *Oh Mercy*, helping to shape their distinctive sounds.

In addition to his production work, he has released several solo albums that showcase his emotive guitar work and richly textured soundscapes. Most recently, he has hit a rich creative seam showcased on his rhythmically complex *Flesh and Machine* and the gorgeously weightless *Goodbye to Language*. On both records, he joins the most forward-looking instincts that keeping up with advancements in studio technology can develop with the natural rootedness that only a lifetime in music can give a person.

In Spite of Ourselves: A Celebration of the Music of John Prine brings together the interpretive talents of multi-instrumentalist/producer Doug Cox, the Juno Award-winning musicians Tom and Kalissa Landa from The Paperboys, much sought-after fiddler and former Prine tourmate Kendel Carson, and Nashville/Vancouver Island songwriter/artist Steve Mitchell.

All lifelong Prine devotees, the members of *In Spite of Ourselves* aren't messing around on these performances: Explore Doug Cox's powerful rendition of "Some Humans Ain't Human," delivered with the gravity and resonance of an Old Testament prophecy. Feel the ache in Steve Mitchell's haunting, heartbroken version of "The Speed of the Sound of Loneliness." Savor the bawdy charm and joyful chemistry of Tom and Kalissa Landa's duet on "In Spite of Ourselves." And witness time seemingly stand still as Kendel Carson reimagines Prine's late-career gem, "Summer's End."

Tragically for all of us, John Prine left this world but thanks to his songs, music fans everywhere have a permanent portal into the little universe of his singular mind.

"Doing it the hard way for 20 years," is a badge **Elliott BROOD** wear with honour. Work, life and love have taken the trio away from their hometowns and headfirst into an ongoing musical journey through distance and time. Now, after being members of this band for nearly half of their lives, Elliott BROOD is never more at home than in the wash of distorted, evocative strings and stomps that make their signature alt country sound. With smile lines and guitar fingers long hardened with callouses, Elliott BROOD has been doing it the hard way, but making it sound easy.

Featuring a blend of acoustic instruments, rural soundscapes and wistful vocals, **Great Lake Swimmers** are a critically acclaimed indie-folk group led by songwriter and vocalist Tony Dekker. The group emerged in the early 2000s with a succession of heavily atmospheric albums recorded in old silos and rural country churches. The result is a lush, atmospheric sound and introspective lyrics rooted in nature that beautifully translates to their live performances. Great Lake Swimmers were shortlisted for the prestigious Polaris Music Prize, nominated for Juno Awards and have been described as "a national treasure" by The CBC.

With the melodious sound of the Kora, Yamoussa Bangoura transports us to a place where the diversity of traditional African arts is illuminated and combined with the virtuosity of a modern North American Circus performance.

Kalabanté Productions was created by Yamoussa Bangoura, a multidisciplinary artist of Guinean origin. Yamoussa's long term dream was founding a school of circus arts and directing his own multidisciplinary company, specializing in the African arts. As the company director, he develops his own shows that over the past several years have been gathering increasing attention and recognition both nationally and internationally and have been performed worldwide.

NPR has celebrated her as a "boundary-pushing feminist trailblazer," for having "long incorporated powerful social statements into her emotional hit songs." Her beloved anthems "Where Have All the Cowboys Gone?" and the theme from Dawson's Creek, "I Don't Want to Wait" are still playlist and radio perennials.

Sophie B. Hawkins has always shown an uncompromising devotion to transcending boundaries and offering up new ways of experiencing the world around us. She's a dynamic, creative force known for a spellbinding live show that all but erases the divide between audience and performer. Hawkins emerged as a vibrant force on the musical landscape with the arrival of her platinum-selling debut album, *Tongues and Tails*, and its iconic lead single "Damn I Wish I Was Your Lover". Her ever-evolving career has included releasing six albums and her music being featured in *Stranger Things, Euphoria* and *Ozark*.

Inn Echo is a 2025 JUNO-nominated trad trio crafting a cinematic, high-energy sound rooted in Celtic traditions. With fierce fiddle, grooving guitar, and soaring cello, they blend original compositions and bold arrangements that push the boundaries of traditional music. Rhythmic, dynamic, and endlessly evolving, their sound is both grounded in heritage and thrillingly fresh.

Formed in 2019 after meeting at a pub session in Charlottetown, Karson McKeown (Ottawa), Tuli Porcher (Victoria), and Tom Gammons (Montana) quickly found a musical kinship that's since led to Music PEI awards and JUNO, ECMA, and CFMA nominations. Their 2023 album, Hemispheres, reflects the landscapes and stories of their international tours, with vivid tracks inspired by places like Vancouver Island, Queensland, and coastal Acadian communities.

Whether invoking an island kitchen party or a quiet starlit sky, Inn Echo plays with heart, precision, and joy. Pull up a chair but keep your dancing shoes on—Inn Echo has stories to share and the tunes to match them.



Michael Kaeshammer isn't so much a piano player as a piano whisperer, a master musician and songwriter able to coax dazzling kaleidoscopic sounds from his instrument in a way few can rival. That gift powers *Turn It Up*, Kaeshammer's superb 15th album, broadly described as "eclectic yet accessible jazz-based pop" though, as with all Kaeshammer's music, far more expansive than one simple description can illustrate.

Across a brilliant, globe-trotting career highlighted by nine tours of China, three appearances at the Olympics and countless shows opposite international superstars, the German-born, B.C.-based Kaeshammer has electrified audiences with his indelible repertoire and consistently positive outlook on life, which infuses his lyrics. "I am a very positive person. I really love playing shows and being on-stage. If *Turn It Up* helps me to do more of that, then I'm all in. Music is my favourite thing to do."

Elisapie's unconditional attachment to her territory and her language, Inuktitut, remains at the core of her creative journey. Born and raised in Salluit, a small village in Nunavik which is only accessible by plane, Elisapie is an emblematic Canadian Inuk singer-songwriter. Since winning her first Juno Award in 2005 with her band Taima, Elisapie's body of work has been praised time and again.

On her fourth solo record *Inuktitut*, Elisapie covered 10 classic rock and pop songs translated into her mother tongue. The result is an emotional, autobiographical soundtrack where each song is associated with a loved one or an intimate story. Acclaimed by audiences and critics alike, *Inuktitut* is the artist's second album to land a shortlist nomination for the Polaris Music Prize. Its success also earned Elisapie a Juno Award in the Contemporary Indigenous Artist of the Year category.

Always surrounded by the best musicians from the Montreal indie and folk scenes, Elisapie makes her culture resonate with finesse by mixing modernity and tradition.

Josh Ritter is a renowned singer, songwriter, musician, artist and best-selling author celebrated for his narrative-driven songwriting that blends folk, Americana, and rock influences.
