## PUBLIC NOTICE TO ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF ST. ALBERT

### BYLAW 13/2026 (SECTION 258 – MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT)

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the City of St. Albert, in the Province of Alberta, has on **May 5, 2026**, given first reading to Borrowing Bylaw 13/2026 which will, upon final passage and approval, will complete the construction (Phase 2) of new wastewater, water, and storm servicing that will support and enable development in the northeast growth basin.

The net amount authorized to be borrowed under Bylaw 13/2026 on the credit and security of the municipality at large, is a sum not exceeding \$88,250,000. The borrowing is to be repayable in combined principal and interest installments over a period not to exceed 20 Years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed on the date of the borrowing, and not to exceed Ten Percent (10%) per annum.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that, unless a petition of the electors for a vote on Borrowing Bylaw 13/2026 is presented, as provided for by Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the Council may pass the Borrowing Bylaw.

All persons interested are hereby notified and are required to govern themselves accordingly. Copies

### INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

- Pursuant to Section 1(1)(i) of the *Municipal Government Act*, an “elector” is a person who is eligible to vote in an election for a councillor under the Local Authorities Election Act. Section 47(1) of Local Authorities Election Act defines an eligible person as a person who:
  - o is at least 18 years old,
  - o is a Canadian citizen, and
  - o resides in Alberta and the person’s place of residence is located in the local jurisdiction on election day.
- A valid petition requires authenticated signatures of a number of electors constituting at least 10% of the population of St. Albert.
- Pursuant to relevant provisions of both the *Municipal Government Act* and City Council

Policy – C-CAO-22 Borrowing Bylaw Advertising, in order to be valid a petition of the electors must be submitted to the Office of the Chief Administrative Officer of St. Albert not later than the close of business on **July 10, 2026**.

- If a petition of electors is not received by **July 10, 2026**, the Council may proceed to pass second and third readings of Bylaw 13/2026 at any time thereafter, but not later than **May 5, 2028**.

### Bylaw 19/2026 - Cherot Redistricting Amendment 20 to Bylaw 18/2024 (Schedule A)

### Bylaw 20/2026 - Cherot Redistricting Exchanging location of Medium Density and High Density Residential

To be conducted as a hybrid in the Council Chambers, 3rd Floor, St. Albert Place, 5 St. Anne Street and virtual via Zoom during the Regular Meeting of Council scheduled for **10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, July 14, 2026.**

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act* a Public Hearing has been scheduled to take place on **Tuesday, July 14, 2026**, for **Bylaw 19/2026 and Bylaw 20/2026.**

**Bylaw 19/2026**, if passed, would see lands in Cherot currently in a holding district (Future Urban Development District) be assigned residential Districts, to enable the further development of the Cherot neighbourhood.

**Bylaw 20/2026**, if passed, would exchange the location of the Medium Density Residential (MDR) and High Density Residential (HDR) District lands, located on either side of Chanter Boulevard.

#### Speaking to City Council at Public Hearing(s)

Unless otherwise indicated in the advertising and notification for the Public Hearing, individuals or groups wishing to address Council on their own behalf at a Public Hearing from a remote location by electronic means of communication must register with Legislative Services at [hearings@stalbert.ca](mailto:hearings@stalbert.ca) by **9:30 a.m.** on the day of the Public Hearing.

Where a Public Hearing offers the option to address Council in person, individuals and groups wishing to address Council on their own behalf in person at the Public Hearing may register with Legislative Services at [hearings@stalbert.ca](mailto:hearings@stalbert.ca) up to one hour prior to the commencement of the Public Hearing and additionally a sign-in sheet will be available at the entrance to Council Chambers for individuals and groups who have not previously registered but wish to address Council on their own behalf in person at the Public Hearing.

Individuals wishing to address Council in the capacity of Agent for one or more other persons at a Public Hearing, whether by electronic means of communication or in person where that format is available, must:

- register with Legislative Services at [hearings@stalbert.ca](mailto:hearings@stalbert.ca) by **3:30 p.m.** on the Friday preceding the Public Hearing, or by **3:30 p.m.** on the Thursday preceding the Public Hearing if the Friday preceding the Public Hearing is a statutory holiday, declaring their intention to act as an Agent at the Public Hearing; and
- submit a separate, completed, and signed Agent Declaration Form for each affected party that they will be representing. The Agent Declaration Form may be obtained from Legislative Services by emailing [hearings@stalbert.ca](mailto:hearings@stalbert.ca) or on our website here: <https://stalbert.ca/cosa/leadership/meetings/hearings/>. An Agent Declaration form

must be signed and dated by **BOTH** the individual being represented AND the representing Agent and must be submitted to Legislative Services at [hearings@stalbert.ca](mailto:hearings@stalbert.ca) no later than **8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, July 14, 2026.**

**NOTE:** Members of the public may speak for up to five minutes. This does not include the time to respond to questions from Members.

#### Written Submissions

Whether or not an individual is making a verbal presentation at a Public Hearing, the following rules govern how written submissions to Council must be made with respect to a Public Hearing:

- written submissions must be emailed to Legislative Services at [hearings@stalbert.ca](mailto:hearings@stalbert.ca) not later than **12:00 noon on Wednesday, July 8, 2026.** Written submissions received by this deadline will be included in the meeting Agenda Package that is distributed to Council members and posted on the City's public website. It is open to members of the public who have missed the written submission deadline to register to speak at a Public Hearing;
- written submissions received either by administration or Councillors after the deadline noted above will not be considered by Council at the Public Hearing; and
- written submissions must include the name of the person making the submission.
