MUSICAL THEATRE

 This show follows 8-year-old Lily Polkadot who just moved to the “squares only” small town of Rockaway. As the first Polkadot in an all square school, Lily faces an almost impossible task of gaining acceptance from her peers. From daily bullying to segregated drinking fountains, Lily’s quest seems hopeless until she meets Sky, a shy square boy whose curiosity for her unique polkadot skin blooms into an unexpected pal-ship. Inspired by the events of The Little Rock 9, Polkadots serves as a history lesson for children, reminding them that our individual differences make us awesome, not outcasts. Learn more at: sact.ca

CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS:

History, civil rights, conflict resolution and bullying.

*AGE/SENSORY CONSIDERATIONS:

Lively singing and dancing, and low venue lights with stage lighting changes. Length may be a factor for younger audiences.

When the dinosaur wanders away from home, he discovers a wonderful world full of creatures that light up the darkness and help him find the true meaning of love. This glow-in-the-dark adventure is visually amazing and has been praised for its cutting-edge blend of puppetry, technology and dance by audiences all over the world. Dino-Light was the recipient of the prestigious Jim Henson Foundation Grant and the first feature-length theatrical production created and performed by Lightwire Theatre.

Dance/movement, creative expression, science/technology, puppetry and visual art/storytelling.

*AGE/SENSORY CONSIDERATIONS:

Dark theatre, lighting effects, and some suspenseful action/music may frighten younger audiences.

With an emphasis on crowd participation and building a raucous, hyper-active atmosphere, a Koo Koo show is a must see to believe.

CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS:

Musical appreciation/expression, melody, rhythm, storytelling, communication, dance/movement, creative expression, exploring ideas/ emotions and attentive viewing/listening.

*AGE/SENSORY CONSIDERATIONS:

Loud music, audience participation, and low venue and bright/flashing lights. Content appropriate to all ages but noise volume and boisterous participation may be too much for younger children.

MUSIC/DANCE/THEATRE

The brothers put a modern spin on the Brothers Grimm stories through songs like Snow White and the Seven Shawties, Down with Rapunzel, and Break, Cinderella, Break!

CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS:

Musical appreciation/expression, acting, movement, storytelling, creative expression, communication and attentive viewing/listening.

*AGE/SENSORY CONSIDERATIONS:

Musical theatre-style singing and dancing with live music, and low venue lights with stage lighting changes. Content related to technology and social media may be less relatable to younger audiences.


CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS:

Courage, bravery, diversity, inclusion, identity, literacy appreciation, storytelling and self-discovery.

*AGE/SENSORY CONSIDERATIONS:

Active listening, audience interaction, and boisterous performances. Relaxed pacing and thoughtful discussion of literature may not sustain the attention of younger audiences.


THE BIGHETTY & BIGHETTY PUPPET SHOW

PUPPETRY

 Puppeteers, the Bighetty brothers, share Indigenous humour* and Cree culture with audiences in their home community of Pukatawagan, MB and around the world. Their Cree-speaking puppet personas engage children in learning the language through spontaneous audience interactions and improvisational antics. No two shows are alike! Expect karaoke sing-alongs and lots of laughter.

CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS:

Indigenous world views, language, creative expression, puppetry, cultures and traditions.

*AGE/SENSORY CONSIDERATIONS:

Loud music, one-on-one audience interactions and performers up close. Content may include slightly off-colour humour: *"Our humour is crass. It's straightforward, which is how Aboriginal humour is... [We've] never really had anyone offended by our humour."* – Ken Bighetty

DANCE/MUSIC/POETRY

As the dancer moves, the yarn gets tangled in a large knot of bright colours, capturing the imagination and curiosity of the show’s young audience. The performance is followed by a “stay and play” activity.
