ST. ALBERT ART IN PUBLIC PLACES

This opportunity is meant to inspire emerging artists to create public art for our city. We know applying to one of our public art calls can be an intimidating process, but this is a chance for those with no or little experience in the public art field to explore creating long-term pieces for their community.

Eligible artists are living in, studying in or exhibiting art in St. Albert. "Emerging Artist" means artists with less than five years of professional practice, which means that if you work well collaboratively and make art, you need no experience as a professional artist. BYLAW 2/2018 MONDAY, FEBRUARY 5, 2018 – 5 P.M. COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ST. ALBERT PLACE

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 2/2018, being Amendment 154 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. Bylaw 2/2018 proposes to make changes to the Land Use Bylaw related to the regulations for Residential Districts.
