DOG-FRIENDLY PARKS AND OFF-LEASH AREAS

Looking for a fun place for your dog to run and play off-leash? Take them to one of St. Albert's Dog-Friendly Parks: Dodger Dog Park or Lacombe Lake Dog Park.

Dodger Dog Friendly-Park is located on the north side of 400 Campbell Road near Servus Credit Union Place. It is a great place for your dog to run and play off-leash while you enjoy the natural setting and socialize with other dog owners!

Lacombe Lake Dog-Friendly Park is located at 151 McKenney Ave. It features a fenced off-leash area, a pond and treed walking trails. Remember that all dogs must be on-leash when outside of the designated dog-friendly park.

There are also many off-leash sites (including outdoor rinks) that are available for dogs when not in use for a sporting activity!

Using Off-Leash Areas

1. Dogs are not allowed in playground areas.
2. Entire area on-leash when organized sporting activities taking place.
3. Trails are on-leash.
4. Please pick up after your pets.

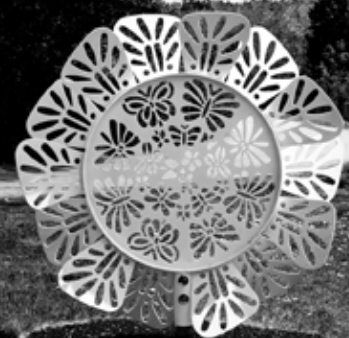
LAW & ORDER

NOISE DURING QUIET HOURS

Municipal Enforcement Services tip: Did you know that it's illegal to create noise exceeding 50 dBA (e.g., similar noise level to a normal conversation) in a residential district during quiet hours?

Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. Monday through Friday; 11 p.m. to 9 a.m. Saturday; 10 p.m. to 9 a.m. Sunday.

YOUNG ARTISTS LEGACY AWARD

The Young Artists Legacy grant program is now taking applications. The grant funds young St. Albert artists, aged 13 to 21, for short-term educational programs, professional development opportunities or travel assistance for events and/or conferences. Individuals receive \$500, while groups receive \$1,000.

SPRING GRANT PROGRAM

- The grant is a special project grant for preventive social services that enrich and strengthen family and community life.
- The project applied for must not be a duplication of an existing service or program and not have received the Spring Grant funding in previous years.
- Thirty percent of the total cost of the project must be supported by the organization through available funds, volunteer hours (\$24.14/hr), and/or in-kind donations.
- The funds may support new initiatives or special projects that support or enhance the delivery of preventive social service programs.
- The funding may be seed funding for a long-term project.
- To be eligible the organization must be a St. Albert not-for-profit in operation for a minimum of one year and primarily serve St. Albert residents.

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 7/2018 being amendment 157 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. Bylaw 7/2018 is a Bylaw to redistrict 3.51 ha± from Urban Reserve (UR) to Medium Density Residential (R3A) described below and shown on the attached map:

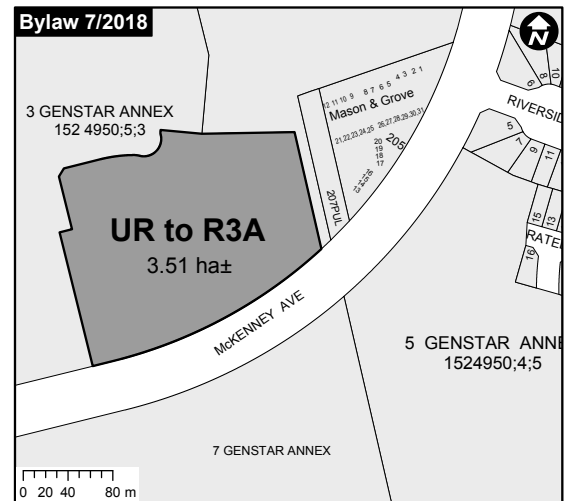
Written Submissions
