WHAT TO DO IN AN EXTENDED POWER OUTAGE

Most power failures last for a short amount of time; however, during severe storms or other emergencies they can last for hours, days or more.

A power outage may leave you without heat, air conditioning, phone, lighting and/or running water.

- Keep refrigerator and freezer doors closed to prevent food from spoiling. Food will remain frozen in a full freezer for 24 to 36 hours if the door remains closed.
- Never use barbecues, camping stoves, propane heaters or generators indoors.
- Text, don't talk for non-emergency communications. Data-based services are less likely to experience network congestion and you don't want to tie up the phone lines during an emergency.

SURVIVORS OF ATTEMPTED SUICIDE GROUP

After a suicide attempt, life can be confusing and filled with conflicting emotions. Due to the stigma associated with suicide, many suicide attempt survivors feel alone on their journey and do not know where to turn for help.

The Survivors of Attempted Suicide Group offers a safe, non-judgmental and supportive space for individuals to talk openly about the feelings that led them to attempt suicide, as well as the impact their attempt has had on their lives.

Groups are eight (8) consecutive weeks and comprised of four (4) to eight (8) people who have survived a suicide attempt.

**Prior to admission, potential members must complete an in-person intake to ensure the group is an appropriate resource. Participants must be 18 years of age or older.*

There is no cost to attend.

This initiative is being funded through a grant provided by the St. Albert Community Foundation.

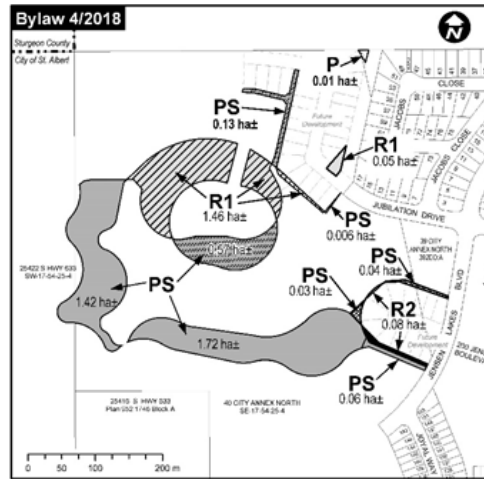
In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 4/2018 being amendment 155 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. Bylaw 4/2018 is a Bylaw to redistrict 5.57 hectares ±, and the breakdown is as follows:

- 3.20 ha ± of Urban Reserve (UR) to Public and Private Service (PS)
- 0.07 ha ± of Urban Reserve (UR) to Low Density Residential (R2)
- 0.71 ha ± of Low Density Residential (R1) to Public and Private Service (PS)
- 0.01 ha ± of Low Density Residential (R1) to Public Park (P)
- 0.05 ha ± of Public Park (P) to Low Density Residential (R1)
- 0.07 ha ± of Low Density Residential (R2) to Public and Private Service (PS)
- 1.46 ha ± of Public and Private Service (PS) to Low Density Residential (R1)
- 0.008 ha ± of Public and Private Service (PS) to Low Density Residential (R2)

The applicant is requesting the redistricting because the current land use districts of the sites do not align with the proposed plans of subdivision for Jensen Lakes Stages 7, 8, and 9, redistricting is required to ensure that the land use districts within Schedule A of the Land Use Bylaw align with the proposed subdivisions.

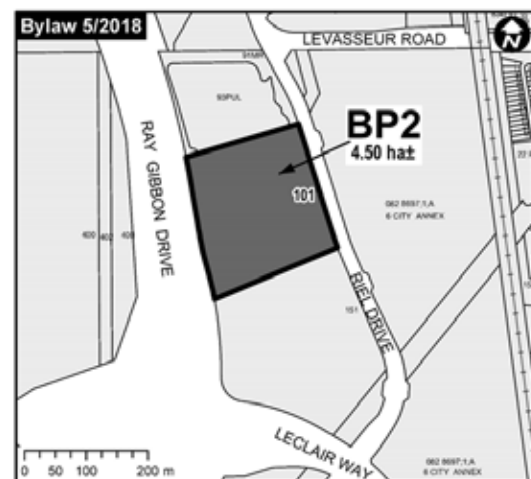

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A. 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 5/2018 being amendment 156 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. Bylaw 5/2018 is a Bylaw to redistrict the site located at 101 Riel Drive (The Enjoy Centre) from Commercial and Industrial Service (CIS) District to Business Park (BP2) Direct Control District. 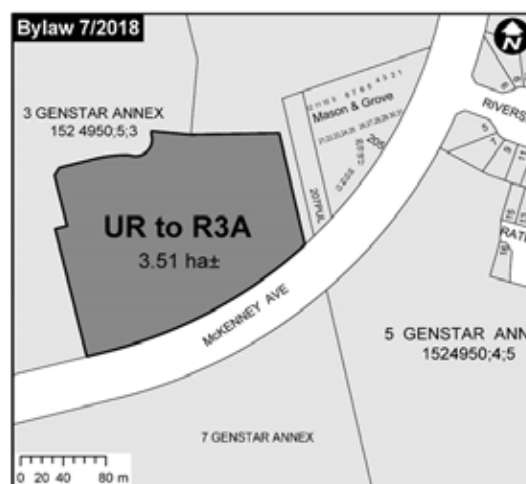
