GARAGE SALE SIGNS

Are you planning a garage sale so you can do some spring cleaning? If so, you should know the rules for placing garage sale signs on boulevards in your neighbourhood. As long as you stay off private property, the City of St. Albert will allow residents to temporarily post garage sale signs on City-owned property.

All you have to do is follow a few simple guidelines. Ensure the sign is less than 1.0 m high and 0.6 m wide; is self-supported; and is put up and taken down within 24 hours of the garage sale. In addition, the sign cannot be within 30.5 m of an intersection, or interfere with vehicle or pedestrian traffic.

Note: A person is permitted to hold a maximum of three garage sales per calendar year. After three garage sales, the person must apply for a Business Licence and the appropriate Development Permits.

DOG-FRIENDLY PARKS AND OFF-LEASH AREAS

Looking for a fun place for your dog to run and play off-leash? Take them to one of St. Albert's Dog-Friendly Parks: Dodger Dog Park or Lacombe Lake Dog Park.

Dodger Dog-Friendly-Park is located on the north side of 400 Campbell Road near Servus Credit Union Place. It is a great place for your dog to run and play off-leash while you enjoy the natural setting and socialize with other dog owners!

Lacombe Lake Dog-Friendly Park is located at 151 McKenney Ave. It features a fenced off-leash area, a pond and treed walking trails. Remember that all dogs must be on-leash when outside of the designated dog-friendly park.

There are also many off-leash sites (including outdoor rinks) that are available for dogs when not in use for a sporting activity!

Using Off-Leash Areas

1. Dogs are not allowed in playground areas.
2. Entire area on-leash when organized sporting activities taking place.
3. Trails are on-leash.
4. Please pick up after your pets.

SURVIVORS OF ATTEMPTED SUICIDE GROUP

After a suicide attempt, life can be confusing and filled with conflicting emotions. Due to the stigma associated with suicide, many suicide attempt survivors feel alone on their journey and do not know where to turn for help.

The Survivors of Attempted Suicide Group offers a safe, non-judgmental and supportive space for individuals to talk openly about the feelings that led them to attempt suicide, as well as the impact their attempt has had on their lives.

Groups are eight (8) consecutive weeks and comprised of four (4) to eight (8) people who have survived a suicide attempt.

**Prior to admission, potential members must complete an in-person intake to ensure the group is an appropriate resource. Participants must be 18 years of age or older.*

There is no cost to attend. This initiative is being funded through a grant provided by the St. Albert Community Foundation.

SOCIAL MASTER PLAN 2017 ANNUAL REPORT

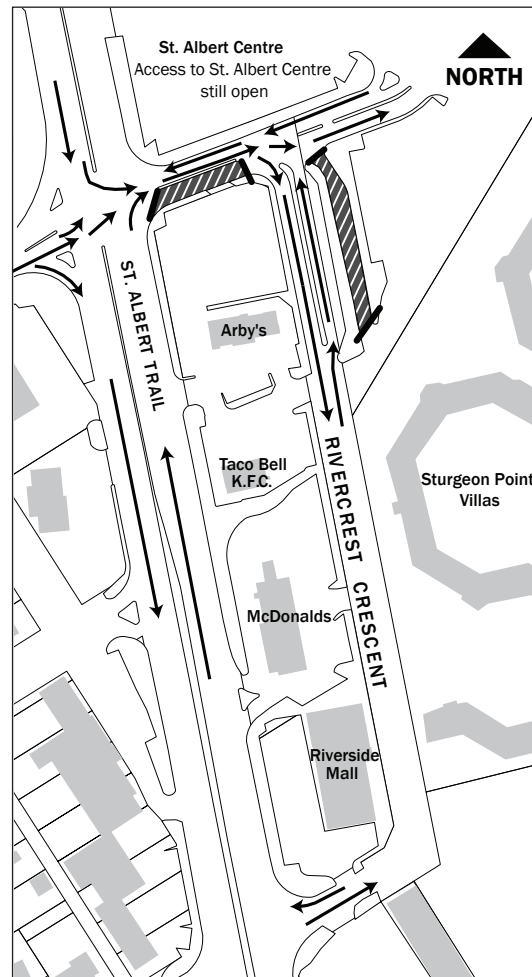
The City of St. Albert's first Social Master Plan, approved in 2013, reflects on key social issues and provides a roadmap for building a caring, connected, inclusive and safe community.

ROTATIONAL RE-INSPECTION NOTICE

The City of St. Albert Assessment department will be conducting rotational re-inspections of residential homes in several St. Albert neighbourhoods from **April to October 2018**. These re-inspections are permissible in accordance with Section 294 of the Municipal Government Act.

Assessors will be conducting re-inspections primarily in the following neighbourhoods:

- Erin Ridge
- Grandin
- Lacombe Park
- Woodlands

If you are away from your home on the day the property assessor calls, they may leave a yellow Notice for Assessment card on your door or in your mailbox, with instructions to telephone our department. All property assessors working in your neighbourhood will be carrying City of St. Albert identification.

- The re-inspection of your property may include a brief interior walk-through of your home or a doorstep interview.
- Re-inspections typically take only 5-10 minutes.
- Property re-inspection programs are a common element within the annual property assessment process.
- Property re-inspections help us to ensure we have accurate data about your home, so that it can be fairly valued for assessment & taxation purposes.
- Our goal is to ensure accuracy, fairness and equity in the preparation of your annual assessment.
