SURVIVORS OF ATTEMPTED SUICIDE GROUP

After a suicide attempt, life can be confusing and filled with conflicting emotions. Due to the stigma associated with suicide, many suicide attempt survivors feel alone on their journey and do not know where to turn for help.

The Survivors of Attempted Suicide Group offers a safe, non-judgmental and supportive space for individuals to talk openly about the feelings that led them to attempt suicide, as well as the impact their attempt has had on their lives.

Groups are eight (8) consecutive weeks and comprised of four (4) to eight (8) people who have survived a suicide attempt.

*Prior to admission, potential members must complete an in-person intake to ensure the group is an appropriate resource. Participants must be 18 years of age or older.

There is no cost to attend.

This initiative is being funded through a grant provided by the St. Albert Community Foundation.

SPRING ROAD CLEANING BEGINS

Public Works is completing the following activities as part of spring cleanup and maintenance operations:

1. Arterial Boulevard Cleaning and Street Sweeping

3. Litter Control
4. Pothole Patching

Major street sweeping and cleaning activities will take place from **May 7 to June 1**, and are weather dependent.

Residents are reminded that if street sweeping falls on a waste pick up day we will commence the sweeping the next day. Subdivision sweeping notification signs will be posted in subdivision entrances prior to work being completed; residents are asked to avoid parking on the streets during these periods to assist the sweeping operations.

2018 MUNICIPAL CENSUS

The City of St. Albert 2018 Municipal Census runs from May 2 to June 18. This year, the online portion of the Census will be available throughout the Census period. Starting May 18, those households that have not completed the Census online will be visited in person by a Census Enumerator. If you complete the Census online, a Census Enumerator will not visit your home. Completing the Census online takes only a few minutes and is as easy as 1-2-3! Residents can complete the Census online using their Unique Access Code (UAC), which will arrive in the mail via Canada Post. Count yourself in!

A new national wireless public alerting system, Alert Ready, marks a significant change to the way the public will receive alert messages. The short alert message you receive on your phone will be the first indication of a serious emergency event and complements other alert distribution methods such as radio, TV and social media.

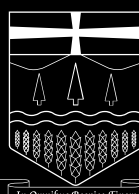
SPOTLIGHT ON

CITY CREST

The City of St. Albert has a policy on the City's official emblems and symbols. The policy outlines the history, meaning and use of these important elements of the City's identity. Over the next few weeks, we'll focus on a specific emblem or symbol and help you learn a bit more about it.

The City of St. Albert Crest features elements that refer to the history, landscape and forward-thinking nature of our community. The stylized cross represents Father Lacombe's mission. The sky and hills reflect the natural beauty of the area. The wavy band is a reference to the Sturgeon River, which flows through the city. The spruce trees signify the lumber used to build the settlement. The wheat at the bottom of the crest symbolizes our agricultural history. The City motto: In Omnibus Respice Finem, means in everything you do look to the end. The Crest is used only for legislative purposes. It was developed in 1967 as a centennial project in celebration of Canada's 100th birthday.

INTERMITTENT LANE CLOSURE – CORNER OF PERRON & ST. ANNE UNTIL OCTOBER 31
