Your feedback will help St. Albert Fire Services evaluate the quality of emergency medical services it provides to the community.

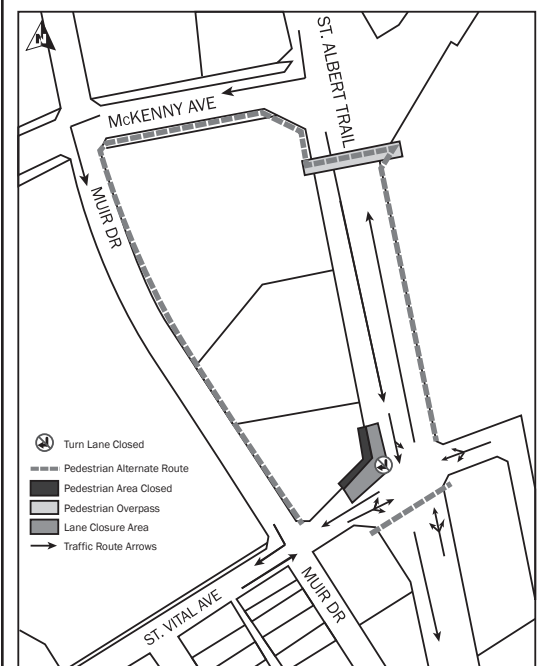

TEMPORARY LANE CLOSURE - ST. ALBERT TRAIL AT ST. VITAL

JULY AND AUGUST

There will be a temporary lane closure off St. Albert Trail southbound to westbound St. Vital Avenue. No right turns will be permitted due to construction. Detour: Please use McKenney Avenue and Muir Drive to travel westbound on St. Vital. Lane closure due to Project 9 construction. Work includes reconnecting the waterline and paving the surface. Obey all signage.

TAKE NOTE

DO YOU KNOW WHAT SHELTER-IN-PLACE MEANS?

Shelter-in-place means Getting Inside and Staying Inside, whether at home, school or work. July can bring severe weather, including tornados, to St. Albert. If you hear instructions to shelter-in-place, make sure you:

- Seek shelter in a basement.
- If there isn't a basement, go to a small interior room, hallway or closet on the ground floor.
- Stay away from windows, doors and outside walls.

HERITAGE LAKES OUTDOOR RINK REFURBISHMENT

The Heritage Lakes Outdoor Rink is closed until the end of summer 2018 for construction. The City is upgrading and replacing the boards and chain link fencing in the outdoor rink, as well as modifying the corner angles to improve rink clearing by ice surfacing equipment. During the closure, dog owners can use the Hampton Park off-leash area.

NOTICE

Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 33/2011, being Amendment 83 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. Bylaw 33/2011 is a bylaw to reclassify a portion of NE 1/4 SEC 7, TWP 54, ROE 25, W4M, known municipally as 8 Genstar Annex or North Ridge, from Urban Reserve (UR) to Low Density Residential (R1) and Park (P) for the purpose of single family residential use.

ACTIVITY ON STURGEON RIVER

Throughout the summer, City staff will be working on the Sturgeon River to monitor and manage flowering rush, an invasive aquatic plant.

Residents may notice staff digging plants from the banks of the Sturgeon River. Also, residents may notice piles of drying flowering rush along the river in various fenced locations. Please do not disturb these piles.

Invasive plants are non-native plants that spread easily, aggressively, and may displace or alter native plant communities. Flowering rush is designated as prohibited noxious in the Alberta Weed Control Act. Municipalities are required to control and destroy them.
