DOG-FRIENDLY PARKS AND OFF-LEASH AREAS

Looking for a fun place for your dog to run and play off-leash? Take them to one of St. Albert's Dog-Friendly Parks – Dodger Dog Park or Lacombe Lake Dog Park.

Dodger Dog-Friendly Park is located on the north side of 400 Campbell Road near Servus Credit Union Place. It is a great place for your dog to run and play off-leash while you enjoy the natural setting and socialize with other dog owners!

Lacombe Lake Dog-Friendly Park is located at 151 McKenney Ave. It features a fenced off-leash area, a pond and treed walking trails. Remember that all dogs must be on-leash when outside of the designated dog-friendly park.

There are also many off-leash sites (including outdoor rinks) that are available for dogs when not in use by a sporting activity!

Using Off-Leash Areas

1. Dogs are not allowed in playground areas.
2. Entire area on-leash when organized sporting activities taking place.
3. Trails are on-leash.
4. Pick up after your pets.

LACOMBE PARK WEST – PARK PLANNING: UPDATED CONCEPT PLANS AND SECOND SURVEY

The Lacombe Park West – Park Planning Open House took place on April 12, 2018 and residents who attended were able to provide feedback on future park planning in Lacombe Park West. As well, an online survey was made available from April 18 - May 1, 2018 for residents who were unable to attend the open house.

The concept plans for Lacombe Park West have recently been updated since the initial open house and survey, and a second survey is now available. The survey will be online until **August 17** and residents are encouraged to view the new concept plans and then fill out the short survey. This feedback will ensure the City has a strong vision for future trail linkages and park amenities for the remaining park sites in Lacombe Park West (Lachance Park and Legacy Stormwater Management Facility).

NOTICE

A Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 332011, being Amendment 80 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. Bylaw 332011 is a bylaw to reclassify a portion of NE 1/4 SEC 7, TWP 54, RGE 25, W4M, known municipally as 8 Genstar Annex or North Ridge Stage 25, from Urban Reserve (UR) to Low Density Residential (R1) and Park (P) for the purpose of single family residential park development.

DUCKWEED

The small green floating plants on water bodies around St. Albert are duckweed, an aquatic plant. Duckweed is often mistaken for algae but in fact it prevents the growth of algae. Duckweed also has other benefits, including preventing mosquitoes, filtering nutrients from the river and stormwater management facilities, and is a source of food for waterfowl and fish.

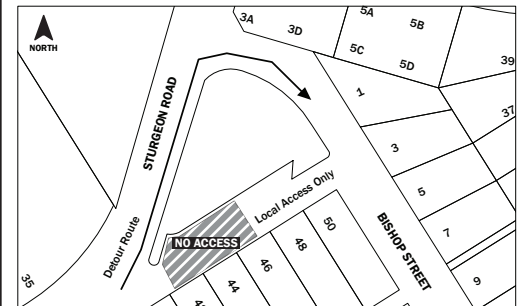
Duckweed is very simple plant with two or three leaves and does not have a stem.
