TIPS FOR EFFECTIVE SNOW REMOVAL

St. Albert Community Standards Bylaw 12/2010 requires residents to eliminate dangerous conditions on sidewalks. Consider using these tips to make this task easier:

- Spray your shovel blade with cooking oil to keep snow from sticking.
- Clear snow right after it falls, before anyone can walk or drive on it.
- Spread sand on your sidewalk before ice forms and builds up.
- Microwave your sand so it will melt snow and ice faster.
- Pile snow in a place where it will not melt onto your driveway or sidewalk during warmer weather.

NOTICE SIDEWALK CLOSURE – USE ALTERNATE ROUTES

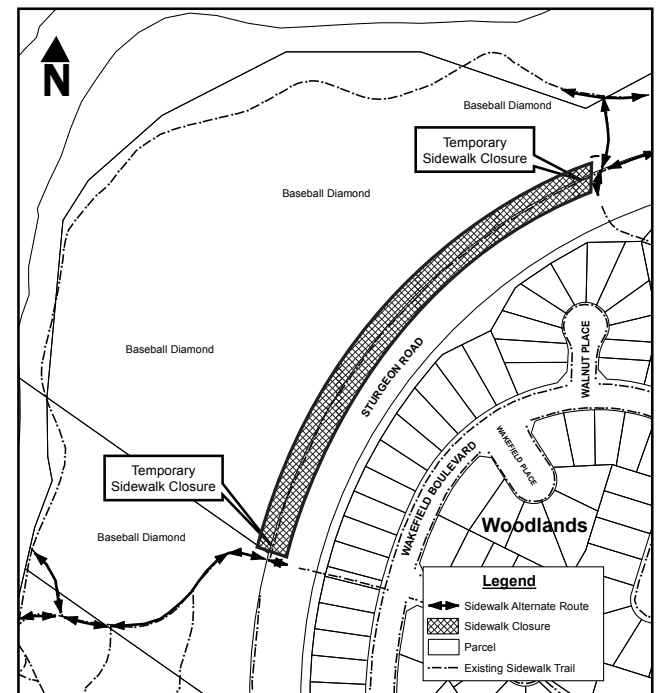
SIDEWALK CLOSURE PORTION OF STURGEON ROAD

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

BYLAW 44/2018

MONDAY, DECEMBER 3, 2018 – 5 PM | COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ST. ALBERT PLACE

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 44/2018, being Amendment 165 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. This Bylaw Amendment is adding “emergency protective services” as a Discretionary Use to the Corridor Commercial District. This would potentially allow a fire hall, police station, or similar facility to be developed on lands districted as Corridor Commercial.

If you submit comments on the bylaw(s), either orally or in writing, the information you provide may be recorded in the minutes of the Public Hearing, or otherwise made public, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
