BYLAW 44/2018

MONDAY, DECEMBER 3, 2018 – 5 PM | COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ST. ALBERT PLACE

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 44/2018, being Amendment 165 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. This Bylaw Amendment is adding "emergency protective services" as a Discretionary Use to the Corridor Commercial District. This would potentially allow a fire hall, police station, or similar facility to be developed on lands districted as Corridor Commercial.

If you submit comments on the bylaw(s), either orally or in writing, the information you provide may be recorded in the minutes of the Public Hearing, or otherwise made public, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
