## SPOTLIGHT ON

### CENSUS POLICY

The City of St. Albert's municipal census is governed by the Census Policy. This policy enables City Council to provide direction to City Administration regarding the census. The policy and the associated Directive describe the purpose of the census and establish clear criteria for how the census is to be conducted by City staff. The policy directs Administration to conduct a municipal census every two years, and to do so on even numbered years. This means the census will take place in 2020, 2022 and so on. The Directive outlines what type of questions will be asked as part of the census and makes it clear that residents' privacy must be protected throughout the process. The census provides information that is extremely important for City planning and helps the City maximize its share of federal and provincial grants. ### BYLAW 37/2018

**MONDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 2019 – 5:00 P.M. | COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ST. ALBERT PLACE**

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 37/2018, being Amendment 163 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. The proposed Bylaw 37/2018 is a "housekeeping" amendment intended to ensure that the Land Use Bylaw is consistent with the new Hen Bylaw. Therefore, Bylaw 37/2018 should only be passed if the Hen Bylaw is passed. The Hen Bylaw is being reviewed by Council on January 7, 2019.
