**New:** Starting **July 1**, the City will be moving to monthly paperless billing for all utility bills.

## SPOTLIGHT ON

### REMINDER: OUTDOOR ICE SAFETY

The City would like to remind residents about the dangers of thin ice and uneven ice in St. Albert.

Other than Lacombe Park Lake, all natural or man-made water bodies, including storm water facilities and the Sturgeon River, are not safe for skating or recreational use. Residents are asked to stay off these ice surfaces at all times and to follow all safety warnings posted at these facilities.

Lacombe Park Lake is the only man-made water body maintained and monitored by the City of St. Albert for outdoor skating. Please obey all signage on site while using the outdoor surface and check stalbert.ca for current updates on skating conditions.

The City also maintains a large number of outdoor rinks for residents to use throughout the winter. As these rinks are subject to changing weather conditions, the surface may not be as smooth as indoor surfaces. Skaters should carefully inspect the ice and watch for uneven patches, cracks or holes. A list of outdoor skating surfaces, including those with heated change buildings, is available on the City website.

### BYLAW 41/2018

#### MONDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2019 – 5:00 P.M. | COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ST. ALBERT PLACE

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26*, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 41/2018, being Amendment 164 to the Land Use Bylaw 9/2005.

NOTE: Council may choose to combine the public hearings for this Bylaw and for Bylaw 16/2018 into a single public hearing for both bylaws.

Bylaw 41/2018 is to redistrict the lands at 130 Element Drive North from Medium/High Density Residential (R4) District to Medium Density Residential (R3A) District, to ultimately accommodate a 70-unit townhouse.
