COMMUNITY SERVICES SPRING GRANT PROGRAM

The City of St. Albert's Community Services is inviting proposals from non-profit organizations for project funding of not more than \$5,700. The following criteria apply:

- The grant is a special project grant for preventive social services that enrich and strengthen family and community life.
- The project applied for must not be a duplication of an existing service or program and must not have received the Spring Grant Funding in previous years.
- Thirty per cent of the total cost of the project must be supported by the organization through available funds, volunteer hours (\$15/hr), and/or in-kind donations.
- The funds may support new initiatives or special projects that support or enhance the delivery of preventive social service programs.
- The funding may be seed funding for a long-term project.
- To be eligible, the organization must be a St. Albert not-for-profit in operation for a minimum of one year and primarily serve St. Albert residents.

REDUCED NEIGHBOURHOOD SPEEDS Erin Ridge and Erin Ridge North

A reminder that speed reductions have been implemented in Erin Ridge and Erin Ridge North on all collector and local roadways. Speed limits are now posted at 40 km/h unless within a school or playground zone. Those travelling in the area are asked to follow all road signage.

Lacombe Park

A reminder that speed reductions will take place in Lacombe Park East neighbourhood, on collector and local roadways between Dawson Road to St. Albert Trail and Giroux Road to McKenney Avenue.

As of **March 18**, speed will be reduced to 40 km/h, unless in a playground zone. Those travelling in the area are asked to follow all road signage.

CITY LAUNCHES OPEN DATA PORTAL

The City has launched its Open Data Portal. Residents can now freely access, download and analyze the City's data.

Datasets now available include the city boundary, parks, parcels, area structure plans, area redevelopment plans, neighbourhoods, photo enforcement mobile locations, photo enforcement intersection safety device camera locations, photo enforcement mobile locations justifications, and cultural facilities. In the coming months, further datasets will be available including City facilities, traffic counts, transit routes and trails.

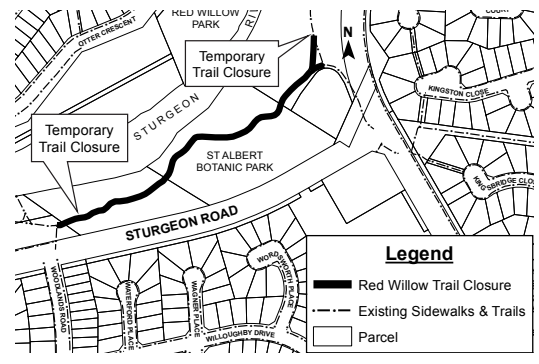

BYLAW 10/2019 BEING AMENDMENT 6 TO OFFSITE LEVY BYLAW 30/2013

TAKE NOTICE that the Municipal Council of the City of St. Albert will be asked to give consideration to passing Bylaw 10/2019, being Amendment #6 to the Off-Site Levy Bylaw 30/2013.

Bylaw 10/2019 will be presented to Council on March 18, 2019 for consideration of all three readings if Council so desires. The purpose of Bylaw 10/2019 is to update the Off-Site Levy Bylaw with respect to: development areas, benefiting areas, the project list and off-site levy rates.

PUBLIC NOTICE TO ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF ST. ALBERT

BYLAW 9/2019

(SECTION 258 – MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT ACT)

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the City of St. Albert, in the Province of Alberta, has given first reading to Borrowing Bylaw 9/2019 which will, upon final passage and approval, authorize the proper officers of the City to borrow monies from the Alberta Capital Finance Authority (ACFA), or other authorized financial institution, by the issuance of a borrowing, to finance the construction of the North St. Albert Trail Corridor Management.

The total cost of the project is estimated at \$26,000,000. The net amount to be borrowed on the credit and security of the municipality at large by the issue of the borrowing is \$26,000,000. The borrowing is to be repayable in semi-annual or annual equal payments of combined principal and interest installments over a period not to exceed Twenty (20) Years calculated at a rate not exceeding the interest rate fixed by ACFA, or another authorized financial institution on the date of the borrowing, and not to exceed Ten Percent (10%) per annum.

NOW THEREFORE NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of the City of St. Albert that, unless a petition of the electors for a vote on Borrowing Bylaw 9/2019 is demanded, as provided for by Section 231 of the *Municipal Government Act*, the Council may pass the Borrowing Bylaw.

All persons interested are hereby notified and are required to govern themselves accordingly. Copies of the proposed bylaw may be examined between the hours of **8:00 a.m.** and **5:00 p.m. weekdays** at the Legislative Services Office (3rd Floor) in City Hall, St. Albert.

INFORMATION FOR ELECTORS

1. Pursuant to Section 1(i) of the *Municipal Government Act*, an "elector" means a person who is eligible to vote in the election for a councillor under the *Local Authorities Election Act*, of which Section 47(1) defines eligibility as a person who:
 - is at least 18 years old,
 - is a Canadian citizen, and
 - has resided in Alberta for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding election day and the person's place of residence is located in the area on election day.
2. A poll may be demanded in the City of St. Albert by electors equal in number to at least 10% of the population in accordance with the Sections 223 of the *Municipal Government Act*.
3. Pursuant to *City Council Policy – C-CAO-22 Borrowing Bylaw Advertising*, "Electors shall have a minimum of 60 days from first reading

of a Borrowing Bylaw to submit a Petition". Consequently, this notice will be initially advertised within 7 days after first reading and the two consecutive weeks of advertising mandated by section 606 of the *Municipal Government Act* will occur no earlier than 40 and 47 days respectively, after first reading.

4. Pursuant to Section 231(3) of the *Municipal Government Act* the petition for a vote must be submitted to the Chief Administrative Officer within 15 days after the last publication of this notice.
5. Further requirements of the petition are provided in Section 224 of the *Municipal Government Act*.

DATE of the last publication of this notice is **March 9, 2019.**

Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act

Should a petition of the electors for a vote on Borrowing Bylaw 9/2019, be received, the names and addresses of signatories to that petition may be made public, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
