DOG-FRIENDLY PARKS AND OFF-LEASH AREAS

Looking for a fun place for your dog to run and play off-leash? Take them to one of St. Albert's Dog-Friendly Parks – Dodger Dog Park or Lacombe Lake Dog Park.

Dodger Dog-Friendly Park is located on the north side of 400 Campbell Road near Servus Credit Union Place. It is a great place for your dog to run and play off-leash while you enjoy the natural setting and socialize with other dog owners.

Lacombe Lake Dog-Friendly Park is located at 151 McKenney Avenue. It features a fenced off-leash area, pond and treed walking trails. Please remember that all dogs must be on-leash when outside of the designated dog-friendly park.

There are also many off-leash sites (including outdoor rinks) that are available for dogs when not in use by a sporting activity!

When using off-leash areas, please remember:

- Dog feces must be picked up immediately when not on an owner's property.
- Dogs must be licensed and remain under the owner's control.
- Walkers must carry a leash at all times. Trails are on-leash.
- Entire area is on-leash when organized sporting activities are taking place.
- Dogs are not allowed in playground areas.

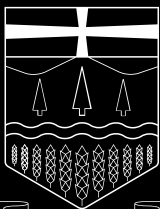
SPOTLIGHT ON

CITY CREST

The City of St. Albert has a policy on the City's official emblems and symbols. The policy outlines the history, meaning and use of these important elements of the City's identity. Over the next few weeks, we'll focus on a specific emblem or symbol and help you learn a bit more about it.

The City of St. Albert Crest features elements that refer to the history, landscape and forward-thinking nature of our community. The stylized cross represents Father Lacombe's mission. The sky and hills reflect the natural beauty of the area. The wavy band is a reference to the Sturgeon River, which flows through the city. The spruce trees signify the lumber used to build the settlement. The wheat at the bottom of the crest symbolizes our agricultural history. The City motto: *In Omnibus Respice Finem*, means in everything you do look to the end. The Crest is used only for legislative purposes. It was developed in 1967 as a centennial project in celebration of Canada's 100th birthday.

LACOMBE LAKE PARK CONSTRUCTION

Construction is taking place at Lacombe Lake Park until October. As a result, visitors to the park should be aware that:

- The pavilion is closed, and visitors will not be able to access the washrooms; portable toilets are available.
- Park users can access the park from trail links on the east and west end of the parking lot.
- The staircase is closed.
- Parking is limited.

Work being done includes:

- Maintenance, repairs and upgrades to the pavilion and walkway.
- Improving accessibility so it is easier to get to the lake from the parking lot.
- Replacing the staircase along the east side of the park.
- Adding a bike repair station near the parking lot.
- Planting more trees, updating signage, and adding benches and trash cans in the off-leash park.

ROTATIONAL RE-INSPECTION NOTICE

The City of St. Albert Assessment Department will be conducting rotational re-inspections of residential homes in several St. Albert neighbourhoods during the months of April to October 2019.

These re-inspections are permissible in accordance with Section 294 of the Municipal Government Act.

Assessors will be conducting re-inspections primarily in the following neighbourhoods:

- Lacombe Park
- Oakmont
- Akinsdale

If you are away from your home on the day the property assessor calls, they may leave a yellow **Notice for Assessment** card on your door or in your mailbox, with instructions to telephone our department.

All property assessors working in your neighbourhood will be carrying City of St. Albert identification.

- The re-inspection of your property may include a brief interior walk through of your home or a doorstep interview.
- Property re-inspections typically take only 10 minutes.
- Property re-inspection programs are a common element within the annual property assessment process.
- Property re-inspections help us to ensure we have accurate data about your home, so that it can be fairly valued for assessment & taxation purposes.
- Our goal is to ensure accuracy, fairness, and equity in the preparation of your annual assessment.
