CITY FLAG

The City of St. Albert has a policy on the City's official emblems and symbols. The policy outlines the history, meaning and use of these important elements of the City's identity. Over the next few weeks, we'll focus on a specific emblem or symbol and help you learn a bit more about it.

The City of St. Albert Flag features an abstract design with the colours white, blue and red. The white and blue colours represent the colours of Québec. This reference pays homage to the Métis and Francophones who first settled in St. Albert. The white, blue and red colours represent the colours of Britain. This reference honours the many Anglophones who contributed to the expansion of the community. The flag was chosen by residents through an official ballot in 1980.

WATER CONSERVATION BYLAW

The Water Conservation Bylaw is now in effect.

From **May 1 to October 1**, municipal supplied water from a hose, pipe, sprinkler, or permanent irrigation system is permitted between the hours of **7 p.m. to 9 a.m.**

There are exceptions:

- You can water at any time if you use a watering can, hose with a nozzle, or drip irrigation.
- Recreational use of sprinklers and water toys are permitted at any time.

WASTE COLLECTION

OOPS! WHAT GOES WHERE? SHREDDED PAPER
