DOG-FRIENDLY PARKS AND OFF-LEASH AREAS

Looking for a fun place for you dog to run and play off-leash? Take them to one of St. Albert's Dog-Friendly Parks - Dodger Dog Park or Lacombe Lake

Dodger Dog-Friendly Park is location on the north side of 400 Campbell Road near Servus Credit Union Place. It is a great place for your dog to run and play off-leash while you enjoy the natural setting an socialize with other dog owners.

Lacombe Lake Dog-Friendly Park is located at 151 McKenney Ave. It features a fenced, off-leash area, pond, and treed walking trails. Please remember that all dogs must be on-leash when outside of the designated dog-friendly park.

There are also many off-leash sites (including outdoor rinks) that are available for dogs when not in use by a sporting activity!

When using off-leash areas, please remember:

- Dog feces must be picked up immediately when not on an owner's property.
- Dogs must be licensed and remain under the owners' control.
- Walkers must carry a leash at all times. Trails are on-leash.
- · Entire area is on-leash when organized sporting activities taking place.
- · Dogs are not allowed in playground areas.

SPOTLIGHT ON

CITY LOGO

The City of St. Albert has a policy on the City's official emblems and symbols. The policy outlines the history, meaning and use of these important elements of the City's identity. Over the next few weeks, we'll focus on a specific emblem or symbol and help you learn a bit more about it.

The City of St. Albert Logo is a stylized representation of the words City of $\operatorname{St.}$ Albert. The logo has taken several different forms. The original logo was adopted in 1977 and was used until 2010, when it was replaced by the current City logo. The current version features the words Cultivate Life. There is also a secondary City Logo, which is often referred to as the Leaf or the Bud. It reflects elements of the primary City logo. Non-profit, non-commercial community groups representing St. Albert can use a third version, which features the Bud and the words The Botanical Arts City.

E-BILLING BEGINS JULY 1!

Sign up today! On **July 1**, the City is moving to monthly paperless billing for all utility bills.

- Still receiving paper bills? Register for e-billing before **July 1**.
- Already signed up for utility e-billing? No action required.

Residents, without home Internet access, can apply for the exemption program now available.

Residents, with home Internet access, who choose to continue to receive mailed paper utility bills will be charged a \$1.02 per bill, starting **July 1**. This is a cost recovery fee.

LACOMBE LAKE PARK CONSTRUCTION

Construction is taking place at Lacombe Lake Park until October. As a result, visitors to the park should be aware that:

- The pavilion is closed, and visitors will not be able to access the washrooms; portable toilets are available.
- Park users can access the park from trail links on the east and west end of the parking lot.
- The staircase is closed.
- Parking is limited.

Work being done includes:

- Maintenance, repairs and upgrades to the pavilion and walkway.
- Improving accessibility so it is easier to get to the lake from the parking lot.
- Replacing the staircase along the east side of the park.
- Adding a bike repair station near the parking lot.
- Planting more trees, updating signage, and adding benches and trash cans in the off-leash park.
