- All remaining items will be taken to the landfill at **1:45 p.m.**

Items that will not be collected include tires, toilets, building materials, propane tanks, barbecues, plastic planter pots and mattresses. All materials will be inspected and any material considered to be unusable will not be accepted.

This event is free, but donations for the St. Albert Food Bank will be collected. **Identification will be requested when dropping items off. "Leave It" is for St. Albert residents only!**

Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 332011, being Amendment 85 to Land Use Bylaw 92005. ### MONTHLY UTILITY E-BILLING – EXEMPTION PROGRAM

Don't have home Internet service? Apply for the exemption program. Exemption forms are now available at Utilities Services, Main Floor, City Hall. Fill out the form and either drop it off or mail it back by **June 17** so you can continue to receive a paper bill on **July 1**. Exemption forms must be submitted two weeks prior to the next billing date. With your exemption, you'll continue to receive paper utility bills at no cost.

### WATER CONSERVATION BYLAW

The Water Conservation Bylaw is now in effect.

From **May 1** to **October 1**, municipal-supplied water from a hose, pipe, sprinkler, or permanent irrigation system is permitted between the hours of **7 p.m.** and **9 a.m.**

There are exceptions:

- You can water at anytime if you use a watering can, hose with nozzle, or drip irrigation.
- Recreational use of sprinklers and water toys are permitted at any time.

## SPOTLIGHT ON

### CITY CHAIN OF OFFICE – PART 1: OVERVIEW

The City of St. Albert has a policy on the City's official emblems and symbols. The policy outlines the history, meaning and use of these important elements of the City's identity. Over the next few weeks, we'll focus on a specific emblem or symbol and help you learn a bit more about it.

The City of St. Albert Chain of Office is a living work of art that celebrates the history of the city. It honours the contributions of those who helped develop St. Albert. The Chain of Office features 12 medallions, each of which depict a key milestone in the city's history. The medallions are joined together by a portion of deer hide, which connects to the back of the chain. It also commemorates the names of all St. Albert mayors since the city was incorporated in 1904.

The Chain of Office is worn by the Mayor on ceremonial occasions, such as the opening of new or renovated facilities, or the delivery of proclamations. When not in use, the Chain of Office is displayed just outside the entrance to Council Chambers, on the Third Floor of St. Albert Place.
