## SPOTLIGHT ON

### CITY CHAIN OF OFFICE – PART 2: MILESTONES

The City of St. Albert has a policy on the City’s official emblems and symbols. The policy outlines the history, meaning and use of these important elements of the City’s identity. Over the past few weeks, we have focused on a specific emblem or symbol to help you learn a bit more about it.

The Chain of Office is used by the Mayor at ceremonial occasions and is part of the City’s permanent art collection. It features 12 medallions, each of which represent a key milestone in St. Albert’s history:

- Cree or Aboriginal
- Founders (Father Lacombe and Bishop Taché)
- Métis Settlement and Culture
- Grey Nuns (Oblates)
- Hudson’s Bay Company
- Dominion of Canada
- Incorporation as a Town
- St. Albert Part of Alberta
- Agricultural Role in Driving Growth
- Incorporation as a City
- Economic Growth and Prosperity
- St. Albert Place

Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 332011, being Amendment 85 to Land Use Bylaw 92005. Bylaw 332011 is a bylaw to restrict a portion of NE 1/4 SEC 7, TWP 54, RGE 25, W4M, known municipally as 8 Genstar Annex of North Ridge 25, from Urban Reserve (UR) to Low Density Residential (R1) and Park (P) for the purpose of single family residential.

### E-BILLING BEGINS JULY 1!

Sign up today! On **July 1**, the City is moving to monthly paperless billing for all utility bills.

- Still receiving paper bills? Register for e-billing before **July 1**.
- Already signed up for utility e-billing? No action required.

Residents, without home Internet access, can apply for the exemption program now available!

Residents, with home Internet access, who choose to continue to receive mailed paper utility bills will be charged \$1.02 per bill, starting **July 1**. This is a cost recovery fee.
