WASTE COLLECTION

STYROFOAM RECYCLING

The City is piloting a Styrofoam recycling program at the Mike Mitchell Recycling Depot.

Residents may now drop-off clean, white Styrofoam blocks from electronics, appliances, or furniture for recycling.

No packing peanuts, coloured Styrofoam or soiled or dirty packaging.

MIKE MITCHELL RECYCLING DEPOT – EXTENDED HOURS PILOT

The Mike Mitchell Recycling Depot will be piloting extended hours of operation for the summer months.

Until **September 30**, the Recycling Depot will be open seven days a week, excluding statutory holidays.

Hours of Operation:

- **Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday:** 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- **Thursday:** 12 to 8 p.m.
- **Saturday and Sunday:** 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

As part of the pilot, we will be requesting identification (e.g. driver's licence or St. Albert utility bill) for information gathering purposes.

CURBSIDE LEAF PICK-UP

Are you cleaning up your yard? The City of St. Albert will pick up leaves from your curbside!

Dates:

- **September 30 to October 11**
- **October 28 to November 8**

Leaves must be placed in paper yard waste bags or put in reusable garbage cans or bins (maximum size of 80L or 21 gallons) and placed at the curb on your waste collection day.

To help reduce the number of single-use items being used in our community, the program will no longer accept plastic bags for pick-up.

Paper yard waste bags can be purchased at local grocery and hardware stores.

LARGE ITEM DROP-OFF EVENT

Do you have items too large for the Brown Garbage Cart? Bring your old furniture and appliances to:

Each item requires two “Extra Garbage” tags, which must be purchased prior to the event from St. Albert Place, Fountain Park Pool or Servus Place.

Items with Freon, such as fridges, freezers and coolers will not be accepted.

Electronics and hazardous waste are not accepted. These can be dropped off at the Mike Mitchell Recycling Depot during regular hours of operation.

MONTHLY UTILITY E-BILLING NOW IN EFFECT!

Monthly paperless billing is now in effect for all utility bills.

Received a paper bill?

Register for e-billing today. Residents, with home Internet access who continue to receive mailed paper utility bills will be charged a cost recovery fee of \$1.02 per bill.

Residents without home Internet access can apply for the exemption program.

Utility bills will continue to be received by residents at approximately the same time each month. However, there will be a transition period from bi-monthly billing to monthly billing.

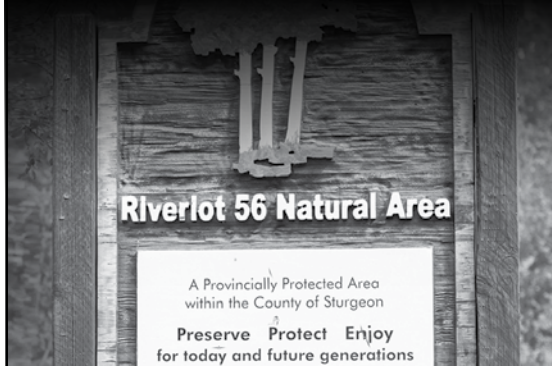

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

BYLAW 27/2019 MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2019 – 5:00 P.M. COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ST. ALBERT PLACE

In accordance with Section 692 of the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.A 2000, Chapter M-26, a Public Hearing has been scheduled for Bylaw 27/2019, being Amendment 171 to Land Use Bylaw 9/2005. The proposed Bylaw 27/2019 is to (a) allow ground located solar collectors as a discretionary use in the Commercial and Industrial Services (CIS) land use district; and (b) clarify that roof-based solar collector systems (already allowed under the LUB) include systems that have no point of attachment to a roof apart from being placed there.

Details of the proposal may be obtained by phoning the Planning Department at 780-459-1642. A link to the proposed bylaw is posted on the City of St. Albert website for your viewing at www.stalbert.ca and search for upcoming Public Hearings or a copy may be examined between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. weekdays at the Legislative Services Department (3rd Floor) in St. Albert Place, St. Albert.

also be heard by City Council by responding when the Chair of the Hearing calls upon any person present to speak in favour of or in opposition to the proposed Bylaw.

If you submit comments on the bylaw, either orally or in writing, the information you provide may be recorded in the minutes of the Public Hearing, or otherwise made public, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
