BE PREPARED: PLAN YOUR HOME ESCAPE ROUTE

Do you know the safest escape route out of your home? When seconds count, it's important that all family members know what to do and where to go.

- Draw a map of your home. Mark two exits from each room and a path to get out of your house from each exit.
- Practice your escape routes twice a year, so all family members know what to do. Conduct one during the day and one at night.
- Plan two separate routes out of your neighbourhood.

TIME TO PRUNE YOUR ELM TREES

The annual elm pruning ban is over until **March 31, 2020**. Now's the time to prune your elms, which will help eliminate the habitat of the elm bark beetle. Specific pruning times are part of the prevention program from the Society to Prevent Dutch Elm Disease (STOPDED).

Here are tips from STOPDED for proper tree pruning:

- Elm trees should be pruned by a professional arborist such as an ISA Certified Arborist. Improper pruning can shorten the tree's lifespan.
- Properly dispose of all pruned elm wood by burning, burying or chipping by **March 31**.
- Please note: it's illegal to store elm firewood since it could harbour elm bark beetles.

SMOKING BYLAW CHANGES

St. Albert has made changes to its Smoking Bylaw.

- Smoking and vaping have been banned in parks and on trails within parks.
- The setback distance from non-residential doors has been changed from five metres to 10 metres. You can still smoke five metres away from windows and air intakes.
- An exemption for traditional pipe ceremonies has been added.

PLAYGROUND ZONE SPEED REVIEW

The City of St. Albert is currently conducting a city-wide review of posted speed limits.

The review includes the evaluation of arterial roads, neighbourhood roads, and school and playground zones.

From the end of **September** to **November 1**, video counters will be placed at 13 school and playground zones.

The data gathered will represent a snapshot of playground and school zone user numbers and help to identify popular times of the day. Once the period of data collection is complete, the cameras will be removed from each area.

IDLE-FREE BYLAW

As the weather turns cooler, residents are reminded of the City of St. Albert's Idle-Free bylaw (Bylaw 16/2007). The bylaw limits idling of parked vehicles to three minutes at any time. This time limit takes into consideration winter temperatures and is based on research from Natural Resources Canada. If we work together, we can all do our part to protect the air quality in our community.

WASTE COLLECTION

CURBSIDE LEAF PICK-UP

Are you cleaning up your yard? The City of St. Albert will pick up leaves from your curbside!

Dates:

- **October 28 to November 8**

Leaves must be placed in **paper yard waste bags** or put in **reusable garbage cans or bins (maximum size of 80L or 21 gallons)** and placed at the curb on your waste collection day.

To help reduce the number of single-use items being used in our community, the program will no longer accept plastic bags for pick-up.

Paper yard waste bags can be purchased at local grocery and hardware stores.

FRANCHISE FEE INCREASE NOTICE

Please be advised that the City of St. Albert is proposing to increase the local access fee, which is charged to FortisAlberta Inc. (FortisAlberta) for use of municipal lands for its power lines effective **January 1, 2020**.

The fee is recovered by FortisAlberta from its customers as the local municipal access fee on electric billings of all customers that receive electric service in the City. This local access fee will be increased from **\$3.18 (5%) to \$4.78 (7.50%)** of the delivery charge of FortisAlberta, excluding energy related riders. This calculation is based on 625kWh consumption in 30 days.

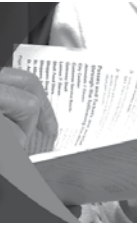
EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES SATISFACTION SURVEY

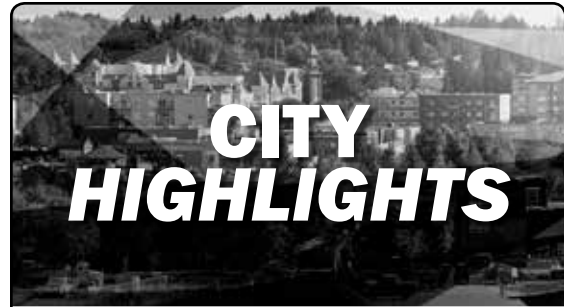
